

Notification For Personal Data Processing

This notification for personal data processing (hereinafter referred to as the "**Notification**") was prepared by the budget organization **SLOVAKIA TRAVEL**, registered at the address: Lamačská cesta 4256/8, 833 04 Bratislava, Slovak Republic, ID: 53 667 506, which was founded by the Ministry of Transport and Construction of the Slovak Republic (hereinafter referred to as the "**Organization**") to provide concise, transparent, comprehensible and easily accessible information regarding the processing of your data.

1. General Introduction

This Notification is prepared within the meaning of Art. 13 and Art. 14 GDPR (, § 19 (General Data Protection Regulation) and § 20 of the Act, and other generally binding legal regulations.

Considering that the Organization is an operator that processes your personal data in connection with the performance of a contract to which the Concerned Person is a contracting party, it allows itself to provide you with all necessary information regarding this processing. The Organization processes the personal data of the Concerned Person to perform the cooperation agreement concluded with the Concerned Person.

At the same time, in connection with the processing of your personal data, a standard, and specific personal data protection is designed and implemented, including adequate technical and organizational measures, to ensure a high level of security of your personal data.

2. Definitions of terms used

By the principle of transparency and comprehensibility, the Organization uses the following terms to provide information within this Notification:

- You are the **Concerned Person** if the Organization processes your personal data in the manner specified in this Notification. Concerned Persons are mainly natural persons who have entered into a cooperation agreement with the Organization;

- **GDPR** is Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and Council of April 27, 2016, on the protection of natural persons about the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, which repeals Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation);
- **The event** is IMTM 2023, Tel Aviv, Israel, which will take place from 14 to 15 February 2023 in Tel Aviv;
- **The law** is Act No. 18/2018 Coll. on the personal data protection and the amendment of certain laws as amended by later legal regulations;

3. Information on the processing of personal data

4. Rights of Concerned Persons

In connection with the personal data processing, you, as the Concerned Person, have the following rights, which you can apply at any time with the Organization in the form of a request. In such a case, the Organization is obliged to provide the Concerned Person with information about the measures taken based on his request without undue delay, but within 1 month at the latest. The Organization may extend this deadline by another 2 months, in this

case, Organisation will inform the Concerned Person of each such extension within 1 month of receiving the request, together with the reasons for missing the deadline.

• Right of access (Article 15 GDPR and Article 21 of the Act)

The Concerned Person has the right to obtain confirmation as to whether the Organization is processing his personal data, and if so, he has the right to obtain access to this personal data. At the same time, the Concerned Person has the right to provide all information within this Notification, while the Organization regularly updates this Notification.

• Right to correction (Art. 16 GDPR and Art. 22 of the Act)

The Concerned Person has the right without undue delay to correct personal data that the Organization processes about him. At the same time, the Concerned Person has the right to supplement incomplete personal data.

• Right to erasure/forgetfulness (Article 17 GDPR and Article 23 of the Act)

The Concerned Person has the right to delete without undue delay personal data that the Organization processes about him. However, the right to erasure is not absolute and at least one of the reasons must be fulfilled according to Art. 17 par. 1 GDPR and § 23 par. 2 of the Act, or the Organization is not obliged to delete such personal data in the cases specified by Art. 17 par. 3 GDPR and § 23 par. 4 of the Act.

• The right to limit processing (Article 18 of the GDPR and Article 24 of the Act)

The Concerned Person has the right to have the Organization limit the processing of his personal data under the conditions specified by Art. 18 GDPR and § 24 of the Act.

• Right to portability (Article 21 GDPR and Article 27 of the Act)

The Concerned Person has the right to obtain the personal data that he has provided to the Organization in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and has the right to transfer this personal data to another operator if he has provided his personal data based on consent and the Organization processes this personal data by automated means.

• The right in connection with automated individual decision-making, including profiling (Art. 22 GDPR and Art. 28 of the Act)

The Concerned Person has the right not to be subject to a decision that is based explicitly on automated processing, including profiling, and which has effects that concern him or similarly significantly affect him.

• The right to file a motion to initiate proceedings (§ 100 of the Act)

The Concerned Person has the right to submit a proposal to initiate proceedings on the protection of personal data by § 100 of the Act to the supervisory authority if he believes that the Organization is processing his personal data in violation of the GDPR or the Act.

The Concerned Person can submit a proposal to initiate proceedings to the Office for Personal Data Protection of the Slovak Republic, Hraničná 12, 820 07 Bratislava. 5. Sources of obtaining personal data

The Organization primarily obtains personal data directly from the Concerned Persons. In some cases, however, the Concerned Persons are not directly in contact with the Organization, and in such cases, the Organization obtains personal data from other sources, which are:

- publicly available sources in which personal data of the Concerned Person are listed;
- employer or business partner of the Concerned Person;
- another person who provides the Organization with personal data of the Concerned Person - in such a case, the providing person is obliged to have the consent of the Concerned Person within § 78 par. 6 of the Act.

6. Recipients of personal data

The Organization may also provide personal data of Concerned Persons to other natural or legal persons, public authorities, or international organizations.

In the case of provision of a Concerned Person's personal data, the Organization ensures the highest possible level of personal data protection, while in the case of provision of personal data to its intermediaries or joint operator, it has concluded a contractual relationship within Art. 26 or Art. 28 GDPR, or § 33 or § 34 of the Act.

The Organization provides personal data of Concerned Persons to the following categories of recipients:

- controlling or controlled entities and other entities in the horizontal or vertical hierarchy of the Organization's organizational structure;
- business partners of the Organization;
- legal, tax, accounting, and IT advisors of the Organization;
- Slovak entities in the field of tourism;

7. Period of storage of personal data

In addition to the specified period of storage of personal data in accordance with point 3 of this Notice, the Organization may storage personal data of Concerned Persons for a longer period, if it is necessary to storage personal data for more than the specified period due to the legitimate interests of the Organization or due to a change in its legal obligations.

8. Transfer of personal data to third countries or international organizations

The Organization may transfer personal data of the Concerned Persons to third countries (countries outside the European Union or the European Economic Area) or international organizations. In case of a possible transfer of personal data to third countries or international organizations, the Organization always undertakes to ensure a sufficient level of protection of the personal data of the Concerned Persons.

The organization does not transfer personal data to third countries or international organizations.

9. Automated individual decision-making, including profiling

The Organization does not use automated individual decision-making, including profiling, when processing the personal data of Concerned Persons.
